

# Greece e Spoon dishes up Greekamole, lavender lemonade | Scrumptious Sheboygan

SHEBOYGAN - Not every city can boast of a Greek restaurant, but I'm certainly glad Sheboygan can.

Situated in the heart of downtown, Greece e Spoon, with its charming play-on-words name and the Zeus decor on its walls, is the answer for any foodie looking for a tasty new experience.

While there are traditional gyros galore and baklava in all of its flaky goodness, the Greece e Spoon is also serving up familiar plates with a Greek twist.

The Greekamole is a lemon garlic avocado dip; it is incredibly smooth but packed with flavor. Being half Mexican, I've had my fair share of guacamole in my life, but I've never had one in which the lemon was truly the star of the show like with the Greekamole. The tangy citrus flavor against the freshness of the avocado flavor was a great mix. Add in the doughy, warm pita bread the dip is served with and you have a great appetizer for two or even a meal for one.

While my stepmother from Thailand enjoys adding lavender flavoring to drinks, it is something that I haven't really seen go mainstream in our neck of the woods. However, the Greece e Spoon offers a lavender lemonade. With a stir of the straw, the yellow drink mixes with the lavender flavor to take on the color. Lemon and lavender make a nice, fresh combo, balancing each other out. And just like the scent is relaxing to smell, I've always found it relaxing to drink as well.

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Of course, you can't have a Greek restaurant without the gyros. While more restaurants in Sheboygan County are starting to offer gyros, you can often only get it with red meat, but the Greece e Spoon also offers chicken for more variety. I've had the chicken gyro and the meat is seasoned well with a tangy lemon flavor to it. The gyros here are stuffed to overflowing on large pitas, which makes even one a hearty meal.

Of course, who could forget the baklava? The iconic Greek pastry is crispy and buttery with flaky layers featuring walnuts, honey, cinnamon and other spices. The walnuts and honey particularly stand out and go well with the mix of other spices. The pastry makes for a quick, light treat to cap off any meal.
